# GROWING CLOSER IN THE NEW YEAR

A quiet nudge. That is what I felt in mid-December when I was beginning a section of a daily meditation called New Daylight. The significance did not become clear until a few days ago.

New Daylight is published in the UK. This author had been living in Australia. Yet I was to learn from his brief biographical entry that his pathway to growing closer to the Lord paralleled mine in several ways. The author was older (born back in 1931). In fact, he died in 2023 after writing the particular series of daily mediations I was reading. He was raised in a church environment and loved the worship music. The music stayed with him all his life. But he did not know Jesus as Lord and Savior until the mid-1970s when he was exposed to the charismatic movement popularized by Fr. Dennis Bennett's book *Nine O'clock in the Morning*. I remember that step as an important part of my faith journey. The author also described leading *Life in the Spirit* seminars, a program which I remembered teaching with our Roman brothers a long time ago. As he grew closer to the Lord, the author eventually was ordained. I do not know whether he was involved in the *Cursillo* movement as I had been or in *Walk to Emmaus*, but his ministry involved serving a number of churches as a bi-vocational priest.

This is just a rough outline, but clearly, the author and I had stopped at some of the same waypoints (or growing places) in following the pathway to maturity in our faith. This was most remarkable in light of the distance between us. Our paths never crossed, but the same Lord was leading us to stop at some of the same places to refresh and renew our faith. So I am thankful for the quiet nudge and the learning experience. Anglicanism is worldwide. God will find us wherever we are.

How will you grow closer to the Lord in 2025? Perhaps it will involve some familiar growing places. Perhaps it will involve some important growing people. But more important than whether it involves programs or persons is whether it ignites (or re-ignites) a passion for the person of our Lord Jesus Christ! You may feel a quiet nudge during a time of prayer or you may recognize the touch of the Lord in some other way. It can be something you read, someone you meet, some experience you have, or even a particular remembrance. There is no universal prescription for spiritual growth, although some components are well-recognized (Scripture study, worship, fellowship, spiritual direction, etc.). What is universal is personal knowledge of Jesus Christ and Him crucified and a closer walk with Him.

I am confident that Jesus will reach out to you, just as He reached out to me and the late Australian author. My prayer is that you will recognize His touch and respond. Even if you have been walking closely with Him, He still reaches out. May He revive in '25!
