## Ash Wednesday Reflections

As we begin this Lenten season it is good to recall the nature of the season. The early Church referred to itself as "The Way." That was meant to be in Biblical language "the way of the Lord" in your life. On this road or path, it represented the teachings of our Lord as he spread his ministry among the people he touched. The early church understood the power of the Holy Spirit as he showed the people "the way." Jesus called the people to repentance and conversion to this new path in their lives.

The gospels show us the lasting way that repentance can stay with us through the overwhelming generosity or God's grace. When we truly come to Jesus and declare him to be the Lord and Savior of our life we have made a tremendous move. Our Lenten observance is to remember the wonderful feelings of God's love for us who set us on our own Way.

Lent is there for us as a 40 day retreat. During this period, we are to prepare ourselves spiritually for the climax of the season with Easter Sunday.

The readings for Ash Wednesday for each year of the three-year cycle are the same.

In the first reading from the Prophet Joel, he is calling on the people to return to the LORD and seek forgiveness for their sins. They are to ask God to spare his people and they would return to fasting and mortification and repentance. They ask God to spare his holy people from punishment. And God relented from punishing his people.

The psalm builds on this theme. "Be merciful, O LORD, for we have sinned." This is another plea for God to overlook the past and bring new clean hearts to his people.

In Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, he tells the people to be reconciled to God and now is the time to do it.

The Gospel reading is Jesus speaking of the three signs visible to show how a change of heart looks. The people would show increased almsgiving, additional prayer time, and fasting. These acts are to be done in the eyes of God alone. There is no value in boasting of your willingness to be servants.

These readings then are the bookmarks of the penitential season. Jesus wanted to see signs of change in the worship of the people

toward a new fresh relationship with God. This is the "Way."

On Ash Wednesday when we are marked with ashes in the sign of the cross on our foreheads, we hear the words, "Remember O man that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

In the book "The Anglican Way" by Thomas McKenzie, the author is repeating this thought. When you have drawn close to Jesus in your life it is vital that you retain that closeness. Jesus is your friend and with you constantly. In a way the thought was like the old WWJD, "What Would Jesus Do." If you were confronted by evil thoughts or tempted to break away from God you needed to remember the Holy Spirit being with you and the presence of Jesus always at your side.

The traditional action for Lenten observance is to give up something or take on something new. Way before the thought of Lent was in my head, I had already taken on this new closeness to Jesus. I remember the feeing I had when I came to him and little by little it had faded. But with the book and the emphasis on the presence of Jesus it brought back new life. McKenzie is always looking for Jesus. A sermon written and given without the primary focus being on Jesus is not worth listening to. Jesus should be the most important guide in our life. In my "Education for Ministry" days the same thought was emphasized. The gospel of salvation given to us by Jesus is primary and essential.

Insight and taking the steps necessary to right the condition we may find ourselves taking a good look where we are in God's sight and getting back in Grace.

God has special blessings in store for us when we take the time to seek Him. May these weeks be that time of reconnecting to the mighty God and Father of the Son of God who is the Resurrection and New Life.

## **Lenten Reflections**

We all know that Lent is traditionally a time for reflection and self-examination. That tradition goes way back, even before what we now call Anglican liturgy was included in the first Book of Common Prayer in 1549. However, with any practice of self-examination comes the temptation to focus more on self than on God, particularly on the grace of God. We seek to maintain our focus on God in our Sunday Eucharistic Liturgy in the Prayer of Humble Access. We lift up that prayer in recognition of God's great gift of mercy. We do not presume to trust in our own righteousness, but in His abundant and great mercies. That is critically important every day of the week, not just on Sundays. It is certainly important in Lent.

This year, in my Lenten struggle to maintain a God-centered focus, a vision of the Cross keeps coming to mind. The vision is of a life-size Cross, not one that will fit in purse or pocket. It is a robust instrument. It can easily hold the weight of an adult - indeed, the weight of an adult Who is taking upon Himself the sin of the world. It is not made of toothpicks and popsicle sticks. Visualize with me railroad ties and light poles.

At the same time, I am reminded that Jesus declared that we are to take up our Cross each day and follow Him (Luke 9:23). So even though the Cross looks to be a weighty burden, He will strengthen us to hoist it on our shoulders, even to share the load with us. Yes, we are lifting as much as we are able. Yet we know in our hearts that we can look to Him to carry as much as we need. Our trust in Him is absolute. His love for us knows no limits.

Balancing what we expect from ourselves and what God expects from us is a daily challenge. Augustine is credited with teaching that we are to pray as though everything depended on God and work as though everything depended on us. The call during the season of Lent is to invite God to walk with us as we delve more deeply into that which most concerns us. The call is to recognize His presence and pay attention to His guidance. Whatever we visualize to help bring us into that kind of intimacy with Him is a precious gift from Him. May you receive such a gift this season of Lent.
