The Collects of Advent

Every Sunday after the opening hymn we say the Collect for Purity. This short prayer is addressed to God for Him to cleanse our hearts and minds and prepare us for the service that follows. He knows us and we ask that he now calm us so that we can have a glorious period of communion and that the Lord will be with us.

And after the Gloria we will pray the Collect for the Day. These short prayers come to us from the historic Church and and proceed the readings from scripture. Many of these ancient prayers were written for us and translated from the ancient Latin prayer by Thomas Cranmer for the 1549 Book of Common Prayer. Each Sunday of the church year has its appropriate Collect with additional collects written to cover Saints Days and other liturgical services.

The usual format for a collect is to open with an address to God and with some praise or attribute attributed to him. Then comes the petition to Him that we ask for and the reason why we ask. It is concluded with a doxology and an Amen said the people.

During the remaining Sundays of Pentecost collects are numbered Propers for the date of the Sunday. Then we will start the new liturgical Year with the four Collects of Advent.

The four Collects of Advent offer to us a concise introduction to the season. We pray for God's grace to sinners. These prayers give us the historic Christian tradition and focus our attention on the scripture for our justification by faith through God's grace. These collects can be found on pages 598 and 599 of the 2019 Anglican Book of Common Prayer.

The collect for the First Sunday of Advent is an 85 word sentence where we ask for God's grace as we prepare for the first and second coming of Christ. The first is the birth of the Messiah and the second coming when he comes to judge the people. The keynote is the asking for God's grace and by that means we can cast away the works of darkness. Sinful man

needs God's grace to accomplish this.

This prayer became a favorite of the people and was read every day during the season of Advent.

The Second Sunday's Collect is the familiar plea for us to hear, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest the Word for our blessed hope for everlasting life. I once heard from a pastor that this collect gave us the opportunity and permission to mark our Bibles. It was quite all right to make notes to ourselves on the pages. This prayer was one of Cranmer's lasting desires for the people to read all scripture and live by it.

The Collect for the Third Sunday of Advent has a change as the prayer is addressed to Lord Jesus rather than to God the Father. We need to prepare for the coming of Christ by hearing the words of the prophets especially John the Baptist. We ned this time in the period of Advent to prepare our hearts and minds to repent and be ready for his coming. We will want to be a people acceptable in Christ's sight when he comes.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent, for some, is known as "Stir up Sunday" with the opening charge for God to show great might among us. This is the Sunday before the birth of Christ, and we will be the ones who will receive the benefits of God's grace through His Son.

These four Collects show us the themes of the historic Anglican traditions. They are used to gather us together in community worship and set the focus for that Sunday's service.
